PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE



LADY KEANE COLLEGE, SHILLONG, established in 1935, is being run by its Governing Body under the sponsorship of Lady Keane College Educational Society [registered under the Meghalaya Societies Registration Act, 12 of 1983 with Registration No. E.16(RS)5/ of 2006/7]. The College was named after Lady Joyce M. Keane – wife of Sir Michael Keane, Governor of Assam (1932-37) – who as a patron, was instrumental in inspiring the founding members and securing the plot of government cantonment land for building the first educational institution exclusively for girls and young women in North East India. First affiliated to Calcutta University in 1938, Lady Keane College got its affiliation status transferred to Gauhati University in 1948, and subsequently has been a premier college affiliated to the North-Eastern Hill University since 1973.

The College has a clear mission to do "whatever necessary and legitimate for the spread of liberal education in all branches among women irrespective of religion, caste, creed or nationality". Besides BA, BSc, BCA, and BTTM we also offer short-term courses in Fashion Designing, Mushroom Cultivation, MS Office (computer), and some Languages. The process of adding some postgraduate courses in the near future has already begun.

With the implementation of the New Education Policy (NEP, 2020) by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India, higher education is currently undergoing rapid transformation. The role of the latter assumes greater significance in promoting human as well as societal well-being and in developing India as envisioned in its Constitution – a democratic, just, socially-conscious, cultured, and humane nation upholding liberty, equality, fraternity, and justice for all. It contributes towards sustainable livelihood, economic growth of the nation and the development of good, thoughtful and creative citizens. Holding its beacons of hope for a brighter future, higher education must therefore, encourage and ignite a spirit of curiosity, a scientific temper and a body of ethical values in our youth, across a range of disciplines – both traditional and vocational. Quality education must prepare the students for a meaningful life of "excellence with integrity", because that is what Lady Keane College is striving for.

LADY KEANE COLLEGE - A BRIEF HISTORY

Lady Keane College a pioneer in the field of women's education in the North- Eastern region of India, was established in the year 1935. With a legacy of eighty four years of eventful existence, the college has to its credit a record of very distinguished service rendered to the cause of upliftment and empowerment of women through the spread of liberal education. The institution today, in many ways, is synonymous with the socioeconomic transformation taking place in the region and beyond.

In 1935, a number of prominent citizens of Shillong convened a meeting and resolved to start an Intermediate College for girls. A managing committee was constituted with Shri A. Das as the Secretary. A bungalow called "Groveside" was acquired. The Bungalow housed the College for two years and wasthe nucleus of all the activities related to the acquisition of a permanent site for Lady Keane College. It was in the first meeting of the Managing Committee at the Groveside on the 23rd of May 1935 that a resolution was passed to open an Intermediate College for the next academic session commencing in July, 1935. Subsequently, the College was affiliated to the Calcutta University in 1938. In 1948, it came under the jurisdiction of the Gauhati University and the North Eastern Hill University in 1973.

The Founding fathers emphasized upon the essence and quality of education to be imparted by this prestigious College in the following words:- The Institution shall be equipped with the necessary facilities to make our women useful and helpful members of the society' capable of taking part in activities related to the moral, social intellectual, physical and economic development of the community at large.

The College offers four programmes of Degree Courses in Bachelor of Arts; Bachelor of Science; Bachelor of Tourism and Travel Management; Bachelor of Computer Applications. Certificate and Diploma Courses which are designed to give the students an edge in the job market are also offered at campus.

The College engages the students in various intellectual, physical and social exercises to promote quality education designed to mould and prepare them for the competitive 21st century life. Information and Communication Technology (ICT) lays a firm foundation for the Institution's curriculum and Remedial Classes, besides regular tutorials and classroom teachings, provide the learners with an easier accessibility to excellence. A team of highly qualified and dedicated staff has richly contributed to the success of the College, a claim that is validated by both the good results attained every year and the placement of a great body of the Alumni in prominent and prestigious positions in the society. This section is continuously reinventing itself through the initiation of new professional courses and more skill enrichment courses.

The College facilitates both academic and cultural exchange programmes with other institutions for faculty and students. Subsequent interactions on the cultural, academic and institutional levels have opened up

vistas of collaborative exchanges intended to broaden and unify the teaching-learning process. The College is equipped with the necessary infrastructure for quality education. It possesses a Library with Internet facilities for both staff and students; an array of subjects, Science and Arts, conventional and professional, under well established Departments for a student to choose from; various support services and amenities; co – curricular and extracurricular activities to promote the holistic development of each student, such as: Sports, Debate, Quiz, Cultural Programmes, Tours, Excursions, Rangers, NCC, NSS and Red Cross Units.

The college was selected in 2018 by the Department of Higher Education, Ministry of HRD, Government of India, to be a recipient of the centrally sponsored scheme under the Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA), to achieve equity, access and excellence in higher education. The scheme covers core areas – viz. Infrastructure Fund and Equity Fund – that we believe will enrich the existing infrastructure, in the college for a holistic system of education.

The motto "Excellence with Integrity" is the driving force behind each endeavour of every single member – past and present – of this College, to impact the life of every young woman who wisely chooses to be nurtured and educated by it.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

The prime concern of the Institute is to develop patterns of teaching at the undergraduate level in all branches.

The other important objective of the Institute is to bring together in one place educational facilities of the highest order for the training of women in all the important branches of academic activities.

ADMISSIONS

The College is affiliated to the North-Eastern Hill University (NEHU) Shillong, and offers admissions for Undergraduate courses in Science and Arts Honours (refer page 11), Semester system (six semesters) leading to the award of Bachelor of Science (Honours) and Bachelor of Arts (Honours).

Professional courses leading to the award of Bachelor of Tourism and Travel Management - 8 semesters (refer page 23) and Bachelor of Computer Applications - 6 semesters (refer page 30).

ENROLLMENT:

- Students hailing from the seven states of North-Eastern India, other parts of India and foreign Countries.
- Students belonging to the ST/SC/OBC communities.
- Differently abled students.

PROCEDURE FOR ADMISSION

Application Form for admission along with one copy of the Prospectus shall be available from the College Office / Website - www.ladykeanecollege.edu.in. Each duly filled in Application Form is to be accompanied with the marksheet of the last Board / University Examination at the time of submission.

Marksheet downloaded from the respective university website is also provisionally acceptable

Students who wish to avail Hostel Accomodation should procure the form from the college office and submit the same to the Hostel Office after securing admission to the course opted. (Refer to page 45)

PROCEDURE TO APPLY

Duly filled in application form accompanied with photo copies of all attested testimonials is to be submitted in the office of the College on or before the last date of submission.

No application received thereafter shall be entertained on any ground whatsoever. The institute will not be responsible for any delay in receipt or loss of applications in postal transit.

Application Form must be accompanied with the following:

- Attested copy of Admit Card and Marksheet of the last Examination.
- Pass Certificate and testimonial of character from the Head of the Institution last attended.
- Two recent passport size photographs.
- A photo copy of either Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe Certificate in case of those belonging to either category.

The name of the Honours subject chosen should be clearly indicated in the specified column.

Honours are offered for the Day and Morning Section students provided they have the minimum qualifying percentage.

Applicants may apply for either Day or Morning Section and the same is to be clearly indicated.

The Application Form is to be filled in legibly by the applicant. Forms which are incomplete or where the subject combinations are not properly mentioned are liable to be rejected. (The College authority reserves the right to refuse admission without assigning any reason).

In case any applicant is found to have furnished false information or certificate, etc. or is found to have withheld or concealed any information in her application will be debarred from admission.

It will be the responsibility of the applicant to ensure that the correct address is given in the application form. The Institute will not be responsible for any loss in transit or incorrect address given by the applicant in the application form.

No applicant should submit more than one application form. However, if of another application form becomes necessary for any reason, the words "Second Application" and Form No. of the earlier application form should be written in red ink on top of second application form. Failure to do so may entail rejection of both applications.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR PHOTOGRAPHS

- -Two (2) recent passport size photographs are required.
- -One photograph should be pasted (not stapled) on the Application Form.
- -Another Photograph (for identity card) attested by a Gazetted Officer / Principal with a clear stamp is to be submitted along with the Application Form.

Applications not complying with these instructions will be rejected

PROCEDURE FOR SELECTION

Based on the result of the Board examination, applicants selected for admission into the Degree Courses (in order of merit will be displayed in the Notice Board).

In case of failure to pay the admission fees before the date and time specified, the seats of such applicants selected would stand forfeited.

After timely payment of Fees, the candidate is considered to be provisionally admitted. The admission is confirmed after verification of the marks secured by the candidate from the original marksheet issued by the Board/University.

When an applicant is provisionally admitted, the following documents must be submitted to the College Office within one month from the date of admission.

- An attested copy of the Marksheet of last Board/University Examination.
- A testimonial of character from the Principal of the School last attended.
- Two recent Passport size photograph of the applicant.
- Original Transfer Certificate from the School last attended (if needed)
- A Scheduled Tribe/Scheduled Caste/Other Backward Caste Certificate (Where applicable)
- Migration Certificate (in Original) for those applicants who passed from Boards/ Universities other than Meghalaya Board of School Education

A student who wishes to discontinue her studies in the College will have to give her application to the Principal, indicating the reasons for the same.

REGISTRATION

A student shall be required to register her name with NORTH EASTERN HILL UNIVERSITY through the College immediately after the first year of admission. Once registered a student is required to complete the course within five years.

CHANGE OF SUBJECT COMBINATION

A subject once opted, cannot be changed. A student who desires to change the subject combination shall have to take fresh admission in the next academic session.

IMPROVEMENT FACILITY

A student can appear for improvement in any paper after passing the final year examination.

- 1. The Improvement facility of an Examination will be given to a desirous student after successful completion of the Honours Degree Course of Six Semesters on the recommendation of the College.
- 2. The facility for improvement will be extended to a student securing less than 45% marks in any papers.
- 3. No forfeiture condition shall be applied to the candidate.
- 4. In case of improvement in the marks, the students will be required to surrender their Original Mark Sheet and the improved Mark Sheet shall be retained by the student.
- 5. A student availing of the improvement facility shall not be eligible for ranking.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

A student should have passed the 10+2 level or Senior School Certificate Examination or any equivalent examination from a recognized Board/University.

International students are required to obtain a minimum of 60% aggregate marks in the 10+2 level/equivalent examinations for admissions to B.Sc. / B.A subject to the approval of the University.

Admission test / Personal Interview will be conducted for applicants seeking admission.

EXAMINATION AND EVALUATION

Examination and Evaluation shall be conducted according to the Ordinances / Regulations of the North Eastern Hill University.

A student shall be declared successful with 'Honours' if she obtains minimum 30% marks in all compulsory papers, securing minimum 45% marks in the Elective Honours paper in aggregate (all Honours paper taken together from I to VI Semesters).

A student shall be declared successful with 'Simple pass' if she obtains minimum 30% marks in all compulsory papers, securing not less than 33% marks, but less than 45% marks in the Honours Paper in aggregate in all Elective Honours Paper taken together from I to VI Semesters.

ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES

The National Graduate Physics Examination Conducted by the Indian Association of Physics Teachers is held Annually in the College. The College also conducts coaching classes for entering into services, tutorial and remedial classes.

ASSESSMENT

During the current academic session the College will conduct the following tests for all classes for assessment:

Internal assessment: There will be internal tests and assignments conducted by the College.

Students who fail to fulfil the requirements for the internal semester marks (Internal Tests and Assignments) will not be allowed to appear in the Final Semester Examination.

Departmental Seminars and Projects: Seminars are regularly held in the College to expose and enlighten the students about the newly developed fields of research relevant to their studies.

It is compulsory that the students appear in all the above tests. Permission form will be issued from the departments if they are to be selected/ not selected to appear for the final examination.

Self financing International students are to obtain permission from the Ministry of External Affairs Government Of India and from the Government Of Meghalaya.

International students under scholarship scheme are to obtain permission from the competent authority from the Government of India and from the Government of Meghalaya.

International students are required to furnish all the necessary documents at the time of admission. However such students are required to produce a valid student's Visa within one month of completion of admission, failing which their admission shall stand cancelled. A copy of the Visa is to be submitted in the College office.

BACHELOR IN TOURISM AND TRAVEL MANAGEMENT

ADMISSION, ASSESSMENT AND ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES

- 1. Eligibility Criteria for Admission: Candidates who have passed the class XII examination in the 10+2 scheme or its equivalent in any discipline from any recognized board securing a minimum of 50% marks in aggregate (45% for SC/ST) are eligible for admission to the programme.
- 2. Admission Procedure: Admission shall be made on merit on the basis of marks obtained in the qualifying examination and/or in the entrance examination and personal interview.
- 3. Examination and Evaluation:
- (i) Evaluation in each course/paper including Practical shall be done on the basis of performance in the internal/continuous assessment and the end-semester/external examination. The weightage for internal/continuous assessment and the end-semester/external examination shall be in the ratio of 2:3.
- (ii) The continuous assessment of students shall be made on the basis of performance in (a) written tests and (b) written assignments/ seminars/quizzes and field reports etc. for determining the performance in the written test, best two out of three written tests shall be considered. In the case of practical and project works, continuous assessment shall be based on practical test/seminar/reports/viva.
- (iii) In order to clear a course, a student shall have to secure at least 40% marks or C Grade in both the continuous assessment and the end-semester examination.
- (iv) A student failing in continuous assessment in any course shall not be permitted to appear in the end semester examination of that course.
- (v) A student, subject to payment of prescribed fees and fulfilment of other conditions laid down by the University, shall be allowed to proceed to the next semester irrespective of backlog of paper(s).
- (vi) A student shall be allowed to clear the backlog of paper(s) in the relevant subsequent semester(s) within a maximum period of twelve semesters (six years).
- (vii) A student shall become eligible to appear in the endsemester of a paper after payment of the prescribed

examination fee and if she has fulfilled the attendance requirement.

4. Award of Grade/Division and Grade Points: In order to qualify for the BTTM Degree, a candidate must secure a minimum of 50% aggregate marks or C Grade with Grade Point 5 and 40% or P Grade with Grade Point 4 in each paper.

- 5. Attendance: A student shall become eligible to appear in the end-semester/external examination of a paper if she has obtained 75% attendance in the paper.
- 6. Internship: Students will have to undergo a four-month internship programme in the Semester VII in any tourism and hospitality related organizations preferably outside of the state. Evaluation will be based on the Log Book maintained by the students and also the presentation of the report at the end of the semester.
- 7. National Fieldtrips: At the end of the Semester III, students will be taken for a National Trip to important tourism places in the country with emphasis on certain themes of tourism activities such adventure, culture, eco-tourism, heritage, cuisine and others. Students will have to bear only 30% of the total cost incurred on accommodation, transportation and other activities at the destinations.

SPORTS

PARA-LEGAL VOLUNTEERS

CONDUCT OF STUDENTS

ATTENDANCE

Only students with 80% attendance will be allowed to appear in the Final Examination.

Any student who is irregular in attendance without permission or fails to join classes on the first day of classes after a vacation or holiday of a one-week duration, the following disciplinary action will be taken:

- 1. For the first time defaulter, the name, class and roll number will appear on the notice board as a warning.
- 2. Continued absence after the warning has been issued, a fine of Rs. 1000 will be imposed along with a compulsory submission of a leave-of-absence application letter.
- 3. The Student will have to secure a minimum of 60% in all internal tests and assignments
- 4. The attendance of the defaulting student will be closely monitored and any absence from any class must be informed to the Principal/Vice-Principal and the Heads of Department.
- 5. The Parents / Guardians of the defaulting student will be informed of the action taken.
- 6. Failure to abide by the above will result in expulsion from the College.

CONDUCT

- A Student must be polite, courteous and respectful towards the staff.
- must be in college uniform in the campus.
- must not distract others in the classroom in any way.
- is expected to be co-operative with all members of the staff.
- is to take responsibility for the actions and accept the consequences that may arise thereof.

DISCIPLINE

- A Student must always carry her College Identity Card and Handbook.
- Must attend all classes regularly and sit for all tests/examinations conducted during the academic session.
- Must maintain 80% attendance or be debarred from appearing for Selection/Internal/Final Examinations. A student who has been absent from classes for more than three consecutive days without intimation from her Parents/guardian will not be allowed to continue attending the classes, without permission from the College Authority.
- Is expected to participate in various academic, cultural, curricular, co-curricular and extension activities organised by the College.
- Practice of any unfair means during Examinations will lead to immediate expulsion from the College. Re-admission will not be entertained.
- A Student must not litter the campus/classroom or damage any College property.
- Use of intoxicants including drugs, chewing of betel nut and tobacco is prohibited within the College campus.
- Use of mobile phones in the College building especially classrooms and examination halls is not allowed.

The Discipline Committee of the College can impose a fine or/and expel any student who violates the College Rules and Regulations.

ANTI RAGGING

In compliance with the directives of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, dated May 16, 2007 in SLP No (s) 24295 of 2006 University of Kerala vs. Council, Principals', Colleges, Kerala & Others (with SLP(C) No. 2429699/ 2004 & W.P. (Crl) No. 173/2006 and SLP(C) No. 14356/2005) and the UGC Regulations on curbing the menace of ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009, the College has formed the an Anti-Ragging Committee, Cell and Squad for overseeing the implementation of the provisions of the verdict with immediate effect.
