Workshop on

"Tackling Unemployment: Reviving Indigenous Local Livelihoods in Meghalaya"

The Career and Counselling Cell, Lady Keane College, Shillong, under the Chief Minister's Youth Development Scheme 2022–23, organized a Workshop on "Tackling Unemployment: Reviving Indigenous Local Livelihoods in Meghalaya" on March 26, 2024, at the College Auditorium. The Workshop was organised for the fourth and final semester students across departments.

The Workshop was also attended by Dr. Riolina J. Nongrum, Associate Professor and Coordinator, Career and Counselling Cell, Mrs. Iohun Dhar, College Counsellor, and members of the Cell. More than 330 students participated in the Workshop.

- 8. Exhibiting of photographs on existing indigenous local livelihoods which are low cost, which can be initiated upon graduating

Dr. Maxwell, in his interview with the media shared that such Workshops are very crucial to create awareness and change mindsets of the students, to enable them to explore avenues and create their own livelihoods, while utilizing the education and knowledge that one has attained.
